

Electrical workers must be licensed

If you're planning any remodeling in your home that will require electrical work, make sure your shopping list includes finding a licensed electrical contractor.

To protect the public from electrical work that does not meet Ontario's safety standards, the Ontario government has passed new legislation that requires all electrical contractors to be licensed by the Electrical Contractor Registration Agency of the **Electrical Safety Authority**. Consumers are now also required by law to hire only licensed electrical contractors.

"Wiring and electrical work is complicated and if performed incorrectly can result in serious injury or fire," said **Peter Marcucci**, regulatory affairs vice-president of the **Electrical Safety Authority**.

Since 1998, 100

Ontario workers and homeowners have been killed by electrocution, and 2,974 electrical fires have been reported in the **Electrical Safety Authority's** 2006 Ontario Electrical Safety Report.
